LIHEAP is Open

LIHEAP cash grants up to \$1,000 available now.

Homeowners, renters, room renters and subsidized housing tenants may be eligible. As a result of the pandemic, LIHEAP helped more than 100k customers and provided more than \$45 million in assistance last year—more than in previous years. However, funding levels are lower this year and grants can take up to 45 days to process. Apply early!

- You don't need to be behind on your PECO bill to apply for LIHEAP assistance. The only requirement is income
- Nothing works without electricity, including your gas heater and cooking appliances. You can assign your LIHEAP grant to go toward your PECO bill
- If your income was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, you may now be eligible for LIHEAP, even if you have not been eligible before






Get to know your heat pump—and how it works.

How does a heat pump work? Heat pumps work more efficiently than conventional heating systems. Heat pumps move air constantly, providing an even and constant air temperature in your home. On most winter days, when the temperature is above freezing, your thermostat can be set at 68 degrees.

What if it's below freezing? Heat pumps have built-in backup systems that are triggered when temperatures dip below freezing. However, backup systems can use a lot of electricity. It's best to keep thermostat set right around 68, then drop the setting a few degrees when the outside temperature dips below freezing.
