

ELECTRIC RATES TO CHANGE BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2021

Beginning with service provided June 1, 2021, changes will affect your monthly electric bill. For a residential customer using 700 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month, the effect of this approved change is a total decrease of \$0.08 to the typical monthly bill, from \$100.54 to \$100.46 or 0.08%. The enclosed bill reflects these changes. Here are the details:

Generation Charges: The costs to purchase electricity are passed along to customers at exactly the prices that PECO pays. The generation charges for residential customers will increase by 0.056 cents to 5.817 cents per kWh beginning June 1, 2021. The charge is \$40.72 per month for a typical residential customer using 700 kWh of electricity per month. The generation charges for small commercial customers will increase by 0.123 cents to 5.366 cents per kWh. The charge is \$536.60 per month for a typical small commercial customer using 10,000 kWh of electricity per month.

Transmission Charges: The Transmission Service Charge (TSC) for residential customers will increase by 0.079 cents to 0.585 cents per kWh. The TSC is \$4.10 per month for a typical residential customer using 700 kWh of electricity per month. The TSC for small commercial customers will decrease by \$0.16 to \$1.24/kWh. The TSC for large commercial customers will decrease by \$0.30 to \$1.08/kWh.

Distribution Charges: The distribution charge includes the Non-Bypassable Transmission Service Charge (NBT) which recovers certain regional power grid charges from all distribution customers. The NBT charge for residential customers will decrease by 0.003 cents to 0.330 cents per kWh. The NBT is \$2.31 per month for a typical residential customer using 700 kWh of electricity per month. The NBT charge for small commercial customers will decrease by \$0.23 to \$0.73/kWh. The NBT charge for large commercial customers will decrease by \$0.14 to \$0.87/kWh.

Energy Efficiency Program Charge (EEPC): This charge recovers the costs associated with state required energy efficiency and conservation programs. The EEPC charge (included in the Distribution Charges) for residential customers will decrease by 0.143 cents to 0.143 cents per kWh. The charge is \$1.00 per month for a typical residential customer using 700 kWh of electricity per month. The EEPC for small commercial customers is decreasing by 0.06 cents to 0.211 cents/kWh. The EEPC for large commercial customers is decreasing by \$0.57 to \$0.63/kWh.
